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

This questionnaire will clarify & capture important elements and aid us in beginning the design process!







The Goal of the Design Process

Reality says that it's not possible to get 100% of everything. In other words, no one house will ever fulfill all of your wishes but the goal is to create a design that satisfies 90 % of all your wishes without leaving any "must have" items behind, optimizing the design while maximizing your highest priorities. The final design should reflect you, your desires, needs, personality and lifestyle and budget. This makes the perfect project or home that is uniquely you.

While going through the different concepts through the design process, don't be afraid of changing the design that is already created. If you feel something isn't quite right or you don't understand something, please share your thoughts. If you feel you are still holding onto initial ideas or earlier designs, again, please share your thoughts. Don't feel like you are creating more work for the designer. We can review where the design started and where it is currently and why. Doing this will reveal that some of these initial ideas or designs may or may not be relevant anymore due to budget, site issues or your highest priorities.

Some important things to keep in mind throughout the design process:

- 1. You can count on the fact that this process will change your initial list of design criteria. Change is a natural part of the design process and it a good thing. As the concepts develop, the opportunities and the problems of the project and your current desire's come to light.
- 2. There are going to be tradeoffs. The most fundamental tradeoff is budget vs. size and complexity and each one will need to be assessed. Typically, the initial list of rooms & wishes will add up to more square footage than the budget will allow. This is where the tradeoffs begin. The numbers have to come close to matching. Thus, something will have to be adjusted. You will have to rethink the square footage or increase your budget.
- 3. Creating a perfect house or renovation project requires good planning and clear communication. A lack of these elements can create pitfalls that could easily have been avoided.
- 4. Have fun! This is only the beginning and although the process can seem overwhelming, demanding, fulfilling, enlightening and exasperating all at the same time, it really is rewarding and magical to see your vision become a reality.

Commonly Encountered Tradeoffs

- a) Quality of material vs. cost of the material
- b) Initial high cost of materials vs. the cost of maintenance or replacement of materials (materials with a high initial cost can reduce the maintenance from little to non, whereas a material that costs less can cost more in maintenance as the years pass)
- c) Wall space: cabinetry, appliances, windows, doors can compete against each other for space. The more you include of one item, the less wall space is available for another.
 - d) Lots of windows vs. the energy efficiency of the house. The more windows there are, the less efficient the house becomes.
- e) Efficiency of structure vs. economic construction costs. The more complex the structure is (several rooflines, curved windows and walls, lots of corners etc) the more it will cost to build.
 - f) Higher ceilings vs. lower ceilings. The higher the ceiling the more sound travels and echoes and the more cold it feels.
- g) Open spaces vs. divided spaces. The more open a space is the less privacy there will be. The more divided the space is, the more chopped up and restricted it will feel.

A Little Bit About You

Wishlist of Rooms

Please categorize each room as an A, B or C.

A: These are your "must haves", elements that the house absolutely must contain, meaning "it's not worth building the house without these elements".

B:These are the elements in which some compromise may be acceptable to you but would like to find a way to make them happen.

C:These are the elements about which you'd say "don't compromise something else for this but if it's possible, please find a way to include it."

Once this has been done, please keep a copy of this list for your notes. As we work through the design process more ideas will come to mind and we can use it as a checklist.
